Call to Worship - Psalm 92:1-4

As the fountain of all truth, goodness, and beauty, God deserves our trust, honor, and adoration. The call to worship invites us to consider whether we are making God the object of our worship, and stirs us to recenter our lives on him alone.

Scripture Reading

Ephesians 5:15-32

15 Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. 18 And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, 19 addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, 20 giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, 21 submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.

22 Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. 23 For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. 24 Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands.

25 Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, 26 that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, 27 so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish.[a] 28 In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. 29 For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, 30 because we are members of his body. 31 "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." 32 This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church.

Sermon: Spirit-Filled Submission

Scripture tells Christians to "be filled with the Spirit" (Ephesians 5:18). This means that they should allow the Spirit's thoughts, words, and desires to influence every aspect of their lives. We are not left to guess what this looks like practically because the outworking of Spirit-filled living is laid out for us in the following verses. When the Spirit fills believers, he produces neither chaos nor tyranny, but order and freedom. That is, Spirit-filled believers *sing* songs of grateful praise to God (5:19-20) and *submit* to one another (5:21). This submission (voluntary order) takes shape within marriage as wives selflessly arrange themselves under the leadership of their husbands (5:22-24) and as husbands selflessly love their wives (5:25-33).

The Bible's teaching that wives should submit to their husbands has been misunderstood and maligned, so it is important that we seek to understand what it is not teaching, what it is teaching, and what practical implications that has for families today.

Questions for Discussion and Application

- 1. Why should every Christian—including Christians who are single or too young to be married—be interested in the well-being of marriages?
- 2. Why do you think God addresses the relationships among husbands, wives, and children in the context of being filled with the Spirit? What does this teach us about God's Spirit? about his desire for families?
- 3. Why do you think so many people in contemporary Western culture have an aversion to the idea of submission?
- 4. How might the idea of submission be abused? What is true about the Bible's teaching in this passage that leaves no room for husbands to mistreat their wives or wives to mistreat their husbands?
- 5. What does it mean to submit? How does the use of this word in 1 Corinthians 15:28 eliminate any idea that submission is a bad thing or that it implies inferiority?
- 6. For wives: Evaluate your attitude toward your husband. How can your thinking and habits be changed to embrace your calling to arrange yourself under your husband's leadership? Do you make it easy or hard for him to embrace his role as leader?
- 7. For husbands: Evaluate your attitude toward your wife. How can your thinking and habits be changed to embrace your calling to love her selflessly? Do you make it easy or hard for her to embrace her role as your wife?

When Sinners Say I Do by Dave Harvey

Mercy sweetens marriage. Where it is absent, two people flog one another over everything from failure to fix the faucet to phone bills. But where it is present, marriage grows sweeter and more delightful, even in the face of challenges, setbacks, and the persistent effects of our remaining sin.

The Meaning of Marriage by Tim Keller

The main barrier to the development of a servant heart in marriage is . . . the radical self-centeredness of the human heart. Self-centeredness is a havoc-wreaking problem in many marriages, and it is the ever-present enemy in every marriage. . . . [It] makes you blind to your own [self-centeredness] while being hypersensitive, offended, and angered by that of others. The result is always a downward spiral into self-pity, anger, and despair, as the relationship gets eaten away into nothing. But the gospel, brought home to your heart by the Spirit, can make you happy enough to be humble, giving you an internal fullness that frees you to be generous with the other even when you are not getting the satisfaction you want out of the relationship. Without the help of the Spirit, without a continual refilling of your soul's tank with the glory and love of the Lord, such submission to the interests of the other is virtually impossible. I call this "love economics." You can only afford to be generous if you actually have some money in the bank to give.

Only if you have the ministry of the Spirit in your life will you be fully furnished to face the challenges of marriage in general. And only if you are filled with the Spirit will you have all you need to perform the duty of serving your spouse in particular.
